Dear Mr. Stein,

This letter responds to the Drone Studios Light Shows request, dated September 14, 2023, for Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) authorization pursuant to Title 14 Code of Federal Regulations (14 CFR) § 89.105 to operate Unmanned Aircraft (UA) without broadcasting Remote Identification (RID) information for the purpose of a Part 107 Drone Light Show.

On behalf of the FAA Administrator, I hereby authorize Drone Studios Light Shows pursuant to § 89.105 to operate its UA in the National Airspace System (NAS) without broadcasting RID information subject to the following Conditions and Limitations.

Conditions and Limitations

1. This letter of authorization shall be presented for inspection upon the request of any authorized representative of the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration, or of any State or municipal official charged with the duty of enforcing local laws or regulations.
2. The holder of this letter of authorization shall be responsible for the strict observance of the terms and provisions contained herein.
3. This authorization is nontransferable.
4. This authorization only applies when the operator is conducting Part 107 Drone Light Show operations.
5. This authorization only applies to operations conducted pursuant to Certificate of Waiver number 107W-2022-00549 that authorizes deviations from 14 CFR § 107.35 for operations of multiple unmanned aircraft.
6. This authorization may be combined with Certificate of Waiver number 107W-2022-00549.
7. When notifying the FAA or filing a Notice to Air Missions (NOTAM) in accordance with the special provisions in Certificate of Waiver number 107W-2022-00549, Drone Studios

Light Shows must indicate that the unmanned aircraft will not have Remote Identification pursuant to this authorization.

8. Nothing in this authorization provides relief, regulatory or otherwise, from seeking airspace authorizations as required by the applicable operating rules, including 14 CFR § 107.41.
9. This authorization does not provide relief from the production requirements in 14 CFR § 89.515, which requires unmanned aircraft produced after September 16, 2022, to have Standard Remote Identification, unless excepted under § 89.501(c).

This authorization is effective immediately and terminates on June 30, 2026, unless sooner superseded, rescinded, or extended.

The Administrator may rescind this authorization at any time. Failure to comply with all of the Conditions and Limitations of this authorization may result in suspension or rescission of this authorization by the FAA.
